Laird Robert Allen III, 61, died at his home in Selinsgrove on Sunday, May 8, 2016, after a short illness, surrounded by family and friends.

He is survived by his wife Judy, of Selinsgrove; son, Grant Allen and his girlfriend Ashley Dalton, of Shamokin Dam; two brothers and sisters-in-law, Charles and Doreen Allen and Scott and Susan Allen, of California; several nieces and nephews; many valued friends; and of course, his cats, Chewy and Waldo.

He was also an avid photographer, music aficionado, and a lifelong Unitarian.

He was a member of the National Speleological Society, the Country Twirlers and Railroaders Square Dance Clubs.


