Perry Como Records Inspirational Songs

Perry Como is singing what we've seen a new RCA Victor album, "When You Come to the End of the Day," and it's a collection of 10 inspirational songs which

fit Perry's talents to perfection.

The Comedian crooner has put his heart and soul into this beautifully produced album with the sincere and spiritual quality of his own LPs. This LP could easily be one of the holiday season's best-selling items.

Along the tunes are "Help Me Whistle," "I'm His Hand," "Whiner Than Goer," "I May Never See You Again," "A Small Victory in the Garden," "May the Good Lord Bless You," "I'll Be There All Through the Night" and "When You Come to the End of the Day."

MILDRED AND JOE McDAY, the harmonica duo, who have loads of fiery and bluesy songs in their many nightclubs, dates, and television appearances, will be on the road again Nov. 20.

Their hot-long, all-star band includes the current United Fund drive which ends Nov. 6.

THE SHOW, the first such all-star variety show to feature a great popular audience, will be broadcast at 13 p.m. Saturday, Nov. 15, from the Civic Auditorium in Allentown, County's third and largest city.
